Spotlight on:

Small and Medium Enterprises (SME) workshop in Bangkok

Recognizing the critical need to enhance business resilience to reduce economic losses and strengthen the overall resilience of national economies, the UN Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNDRR) organized a consultation among relevant business networks and technical experts in December 2019. The consultation focused on the needs of business enterprises, in particular, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). The consultation provided a platform where network organizations and technical experts in the Asia-Pacific region shared good practices on how to strengthen business resilience of the MSMEs. In December 2019, UNDRR launched the survey "Building MSME Resilience" and is greatly encouraging ARISE members to take part in the survey by the end of January 2020.

In depth:

ARISE Philippines

The journey of ARISE Philippines was born out of a shared vision of private sector institutions in the country; a vision wherein the country is disaster resilient and climate smart. ARISE Philippines is committed to achieve the targets of the Sendai Framework via Information, Education and Communication (IEC) campaigns, Public-Private Partnership (PPP), and Pre-agreement activations for disaster response. In terms of Education, ARISE Philippines member networks have developed curricula on the Master of Disaster Risk and Resilience, the Executive Master in Disaster Risk and Crisis Management Degree and the Future Bridging Leaders' Program, Honing Agents for National Disaster Awareness (HANDA) Program

and Sustainability Reporting. The importance of knowledge sharing on how to build houses using disaster-resistant construction practices are also provided by ARISE members. In terms of private-public partnerships, ARISE Philippines is proud to partner with the National Resilience Council or NRC, the first public-private partnership on disaster risk reduction, which enables both the government and the private sector to work together towards the shared vision of a resilient Philippines. To address the urgent need of disaster response, ARISE Philippines embarked on a Pre-Agreement with the Office of the Civil Defense (OCD) and Nature's Spring for the delivery of bottled water in affected areas.
